The USFW-NC Eliza Armstrong Cox Scholarship committee met in April and 8 applicants were approved to receive the 2024-2025 scholarships. The selection committee included Alicia Sharp, USFW-NC Treasurer, Lee Van Hughes, Pat Davis, and Bennie Burton.

The four **new applicants**, or first time applicants, will receive \$500 each for the 2024-2025 school year. The applicants were Hunter Hall from Forbush Friends, Maggie Ray from Deep Creek Friends, Sadie Badgett from White Plains Friends and Rachel Wilcox from Somerton Friends Meeting.

The four **returning applicants** will receive \$650 each. The returning applicants were Haley Quate from Deep Creek Friends, Oliva Ray from Deep Creek Friends, Joseph Coltrane from Centre Friends, and Lemuel Coltrane from Centre Friends Meeting.

The total money granted this year for the 8 applicants will be \$4600. The amount of money granted each year, depends on the money available and the number of applicants approved to receive the scholarship.

For 2024-2025 the committee also approved \$1300 for the **International Scholarship for Friends Theological College**.

It was heartwarming to read the academic accomplishments of these young people and their growth in Christ Our Savoir.

REPORT ON RE-USABLE SANITARY PADS WORK IN JANUARY AND FEBRUARY, 2024

In the month of January, I made more sanitary pads and taught some ladies to help me and I was able to make 640 pads in total. I had received \$600 from a friend in Winchester Monthly Meeting in November, 2023 which enabled me to do this work.

Here is my tailoring training centre hall where we are making the pads in preparation for Kakamega trip.







We went to St Antony Primary Iloro and trained 100 girls on making re-usable sanitary pads and I had distributed to them some pads in August, 2023.

I have printed the latest Advocate cover in my article. I am committed again to encourage everyone to have their own subscription to the Advocate.



Excerpt 1: "During the Sunday School hour on each fifth Sunday of the year, my meeting sponsors a special mission project, usually targeting a local need that has been identified. Sometimes we pack Friends Emergency Material Assistance Program (FEMAP) kits for farm workers, school children, newborns, or newcomers. Other times we have packed supplies to be used at the Jamaica Bible Schools or filled backpacks for school children who experience food insecurity on weekends. Recently, we invited the Advocates for Abused and Neglected Children of Randolph County, NC (where our meeting is located) to tell us more about their work."

Question #1: What is the name of the program that Rita and her church packs kits for?

Excerpt 2: "Recently I read a blog by Mari-Anna Stålnacke* who describes her blog *Flowing Faith* as a tool "for talking of God so that everyone might know the love of God, receive the grace of Christ, and live in the presence of the Holy Spirit." In this blog, she describes how living filled with the Holy Spirit



allows us to live in color, the way Jesus modeled a life of love, not fear. She demonstrates this thought with a YouTube series, *Holy Moly*, an animated cartoon that illustrates what a life of color versus black and white looks like."

Pray without Ceasing

Paul wrote in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 that we should "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing. In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you."

Why should we take time to pray?

When you meet a new neighbor or a new member of your meeting, how do you get to know this new acquaintance? It is by spending time with them and talking with them that you learn about them and they learn about you. That is what prayer is all about! When we spend time in prayer, we talk to God and if we listen, He will talk to us. The more time we spend talking to God, the closer we grow to Him. We will live with God in our hearts and mind. We will give thanks for everything and God will give us strength and guidance.

We can pray anytime, anywhere and in any situation. Our prayers can tell God about our happiness, our sorrows and our anxieties. Prayers don't have to be complicated or lengthy. We can say a Breath Prayer. That is a short prayer that is usually one sentence, that is rooted in scripture and is focused on and directed to God. One example of a Breath Prayer is what is called the Jesus prayer, "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner." Inhale fully with the first half of the sentence and exhale slowly as you say the second half of the sentence. The breathing helps you to center on what you are saying to God. Closing your eyes as you talk to God may help you to focus, too.

Here are a few other examples of a Breath Prayer: "Fill me Spirit, with your love." "The Lord is my shepherd." "Make clear my way, oh God." "Thank you God for your love." It doesn't take long to say a Breath Prayer. The important thing is to focus on God when you say it.

Praying you will find time to say breath prayers all day long and through those simple prayers, you will find yourself building a closer relationship with God.



CHRISTIAN SERVICE

It has been almost a year since I told you about a wonderful woman, Emma Condori Mamani, and the remarkable work she is doing for her community in the Altiplano region of Bolivia, South America. As director of Friends International Bilingual Center (FIBC) in LaPaz, Bolivia, Emma nurtures the lives of Quakers, especially Young Friends, through Christian education workshops and courses that give them opportunities to live out their faith.

These Aymara Indigenous people live in the highland region where changes in the climate affect their daily lives. They live at elevations of 14,000 feet and depend on potatoes for their food supply and the main crop that grows at that altitude. One project, the Food Security Project, worked to raise funding and provide potatoes to 300 families to sustain them after the entire potato crop failed in 2022. Severe drought resulted in NO harvest that year. Each year the potato harvest produces food for the year and seed potatoes for the next year's crop.

Another project spearheaded by the Young Adult Friends at FIBC involves installing Biosand Water Filters and teaching the people in rural areas to use them for clean drinking water. Access to clean, safe water increases the health and well-being of the people of the Altiplano region. They hope to share this project with other parts of the country to help improve the lives of all.

Emma has an important story to tell and frequently travels to other countries, speaking to Quaker groups who are interested in supporting the work being done in Bolivia by FIBC. She tells them when she was young, she was "inspired to be a Quaker by how her Mom and other adult Friends worshipped God and lived out their faith in Truth and Spirit. The Holy Spirit of God has taught me and guided me to love and take care of others, including the creation. I see and feel the presence of God in them all the time."


